

The Master Surgeon Trust – Annual progress Report 2017/18

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Introduction

The year 2017/18 has been a successful year for The Master Surgeon Trust under the leadership and guidance of our Chairman Mr Ross K McMahon as well as the executive committee. We have expanded upon the core operational areas of the charity with expanding membership, popularity and revenue. Please see below for a breakdown of this.

The Master Surgeon Trust is a UK medical education charity founded in 2013 with the aims of ongoing operation, expansion of the www.themastersurgeon.com website (founded in 2010 by Mr Dev Mittapalli and co-founded by Mr Kasun Wanigasooriya). Secondary aims were to develop free, affordable courses and other resources for medical and surgical trainees. Core operational areas:

- 1. The Master Surgeon Website
 - a. We have now reached 289 questions owing to the contributions by existing members and new members
 - b. We exceeded 2.8 million page views this year since launch
 - c. We have been visited by 1.3 million unique visitors with over 1 million sessions
 - d. "Pancreatitis Scoring" still the most viewed page -Anecdotal evidence suggests we are the most commonly used source by clinicians in the UK to carry out pancreatitis severity assessment using the Glasgow Score
 - e. Our services are being used by many across the globe
- 2. The Master Surgeon Trust courses
 - a. The P2P course was run for the third time in July 2017 with positive feedback from faculty and participants.

- 3. The Master Surgeon Trust
 - a. Membership and demand for membership is continuing to grow locally in the United Kingdom and internationally.
 - b. Regular meetings held to ensure a democratic process of governance within the organisation
 - c. Our revenue and charitable donations continues to grow since its launch in 2013.

 - a. We have over 2100 Facebook [™] friends
 - b. We also have many Twitter [™] followers
 - c. We have increased outreach via ASiT Conference and TMS Business Cards
 - d. A WhatsApp [™] group for the core UK based membership
